1 次の文章に関して空所補充問題と読解問題がある。まず本文の(1)から(6)までの空所を埋めるために、前後関係から考えて最も適切だと思うものをAからCの選択肢より1つ選び、解答欄の記号にマークしなさい。次に、内容に関する(7)-(9)の設問について、文章の内容から判断して最も適切だと思うものをAからDの選択肢より1つ選び、解答欄の記号にマークしなさい。[30点]

Animated films (or *anime*, as they are called in Japan) are a popular form of entertainment for children and adults alike today. If you mention the word "animation," many people think of Walt Disney and his famous characters, such as Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck, that appeared back in the 1920s. But the history of animation dates back years before Walt Disney first began making films in Hollywood.

The earliest animated films, which appeared around 1900, ((1)) [A. attained a good reputation B. took a long time to make C. did not cost a lot]. This was because the technology was very limited at the time. The creators had to draw each image and photograph it, adding small changes each time to create the illusion of movement. This method was called "stop-motion animation." It was used to make the 1906 film, Humorous Phases of Funny Faces, directed by James Stuart Blackton, which is often considered to be the world's first animated film. This early film ((2))[A. forbade film makers B. encouraged other directors C. urged local governments] to try making animated films.

One of the most famous of these early directors was Winsor McCay, an artist and cartoonist. In 1914, he created a very popular animated film titled *Gertie the Dinosaur*. Creating this film required McCay to draw over 10,000 illustrations on rice paper by himself. This was very difficult and time-consuming. The huge amount of time needed to make these animated films was a ((3))[A. sensitive belief B. potential

profit C. critical problem].

Around the same time, a man named John Bray began to look for a way to produce animated films ((4))[A. fully in detail B. more loudly and vividly C. quickly and cheaply]. He created a new technique to produce hundreds of identical background images, with blank spaces where the moving images could be added later. Bray went on to create the first full-color animation, *The Debut of Thomas the Cat*, released in 1920.

Another cat, named Felix, was even more famous during the 1920s. The Felix the Cat character first appeared in a cartoon in 1919. Soon after, several animated films featuring the cat were also made. Not only were the films extremely popular, but many toys and other products related to the Felix character were created.

In the late 1920s, the popularity of the character ((5))[A. began to decline B. was expected to regain C. suddenly expanded]. One reason was that the producers of the Felix the Cat films were too slow to adapt to the new "sound" technology. Other producers were creating animated films in which the characters could talk. One of these producers was Walt Disney, who created a sound animation in 1928 titled *Steamboat Willie* starring a mouse named Mickey and his girlfriend Minnie. ((6))[A. For instance B. Before long C. But still], Mickey became more famous than Felix. This was the beginning of a new era in animation—the age of sound films and the studio of Walt Disney.

  - 1. For most people, the evidence that our planet is round is so overwhelming that we don't even consider other possibilities.
  - 2. These "Flat Earthers" believe as they do mainly because they are unable to see the curvature\* of the earth along the horizon.
  - 3. Flat Earthers believe that the photographic images we have of a spherical earth are digitally fabricated\* to deceive everyone and that GPS devices are rigged to make airline pilots believe they are flying around the earth when they are only flying in straight lines over a disc. \_\_\_\_\_
  - 4. An early advocate of the theory that the earth is flat was Samuel Rowbotham, who wrote an anti-round-earth pamphlet in the 19th century called *Zetetic Astronomy*.
  - 5. The fact that Flat Earthers are willing to reject mountains of evidence and the overwhelming consensus of scientists and prefer to believe in their own power of observation is not an isolated curiosity.

- A. The first word of the title means "proceeding by inquiry." The document is often used by Flat Earthers to describe their alternative to the scientific method the way modern scientists develop theories. That is, they test suppositions or hypotheses by trying to prove they are false, in order to establish that what we observe in the universe should be believed.
- B. They say the earth is shaped like a disc, with the Arctic Circle at the center of the disc and Antarctica around the edge of the disc forming a high wall of ice. They believe that the sun, moon and stars are spheres that move around above the earth, illuminating it in different places throughout the day or night from a distance of less than 5,000 kilometers from the earth.
- C. However, there are a growing number of people who don't believe in a spherical earth. They have developed various explanations for their belief in a flat earth.
- D. The organization responsible for this deception, they say, is NASA, the American space agency. They claim that the probable motive for NASA telling everyone the earth is round is mainly financial, since it is much easier and cheaper to run a fake space program than a real one.

E. Many scientific theories have been disproved as new research and

evidence came to light. The fields of geology and geography are

certainly not exceptions to this trend. For example, if we compare a

geography textbook from the 17th century to a current one, the

differences will be obvious, and we can clearly see how much science

has progressed over the course of four centuries.

F. It should be viewed as part of a much larger trend in recent

decades. Not knowing things has always been part of humanity. But

rather than seeking to follow conventional wisdom, more and more

people have concluded that questioning science as is known today is

better. Rejecting widely accepted truths makes such people feel they

are wielding power over the world's elite, whom they regard

increasingly with mistrust and even disdain. So it is unsurprising

that quite a few people are added each year to the numbers of Flat

Earthers.

#### 設問に答えなさい。[23点]

This was the original product of many fast food chains, but over the decades, the range of burgers has developed to include chicken, fish, and even vegetarian burgers. In the present age of concern about global warming and greenhouse gases, there is a lot of debate about the mass production of beef, which needs huge resources of land, food and water. A challenging question raised by this discussion is: would it be possible to take some stem cells\* from a cow and "grow them" into a mass that could be made into a burger? At Maastricht University in the Netherlands, they have been working on such a research project for several years. A few years ago, the first burger created using this stem cell harvesting and growing was presented to the public. Unfortunately, at a cost of over \$250,000 for this prototype, the expression "cheap fast food" has been lost. It could take 20 years for the process to be viable\* as meat production, but it could offer very big benefits to the environment if it works. Using stem cells from a cow instead of needing the full animal could use 90 percent less land and there would be a 90 percent saving on the amount of water needed. Only using the stem cells from a few cows would reduce the amount of feed needed, too, by 70 percent, compared with present mass production methods.




